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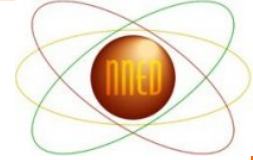

Why Can't I sleep? Why do I feel so numb? Addressing Re-experiencing & Avoidance in Victims of Urban Trauma

Presenters: Theodore Corbin, MD, MPP & John Rich MD, MPH

This webinar will address PTSD symptoms of re-experiencing and avoidance. The presenters will discuss these symptom clusters, addressing their physiological origins, and presenting cases of young urban clients and how they experience these symptoms. The presenters will then discuss how these symptoms impact on the risk of future violent injury. The webinar will then move to assessment of re-experiencing and avoidance and how providers who recognize these symptoms can intervene effectively in a trauma-informed manner.
