

What is AIM?

AIM (At-Risk Intervention and Mentoring) a hospital-based program targeting at-risk and gang affected youth who present at Denver Health for acute medical care. The program's goal is to identify these youth and connect them with:

1. Focused mentoring through our partnered local grassroots outreach worker organizations, the Gang Rescue and Support Project (GRASP) and the Prodigal Son Initiative (PSI)

2. Support services through the Gang Reduction Initiative of Denver (GRID) which provides resources for mental health, drug addiction, education, job placement, and housing relocation.
